




Project To Date

What is Purpose of Scoping?

- Process to establish written outline for the Draft Generic Environmental Impact Statement (DGEIS)
- Identifies topics to address in DGEIS
- Focuses-in on potentially significant adverse impacts
- Ensures public participation
- Process for scoping is set out in SEQRA Regulations: 6 NYCRR 617.8







What is a Scoping Session?

- Meeting to obtain public input for establishing the final outline of contents of a Draft Generic Environmental Impact Statement (DGEIS)
- Obtain public comments on 7/11/19 Draft Scoping Outline
- Not meant for answering questions on the spot.
- Questions and comments are received and will be considered by Town Board for adoption of Final Scope.

What is a Generic Environmental Impact Statement (GEIS)?

A type of environmental analysis used to consider broad-based actions, or related actions, that agencies may approve, fund, or directly undertake.

Broader focus within a GEIS allows Lead Agency to:

- Conceptually analyze proposed actions
- Evaluate potentially significant cumulative impacts of a set of actions
- Assess/ compare Alternatives
- Assess environmental impacts of potential land use/development plan changes







Alternatives

- 1. DGEIS will describe/ evaluate alternative land use and community development strategies to amend 2004 Comprehensive Plan with respect to Northeast Ramapo
- 2. Each alternative likely may have different potential impacts
- 3. Alternatives will be reviewed in terms of:
 - Potential significant adverse impacts; and
 - Corresponding mitigation strategies
- 4. There is no Preferred Alternative at this time
- 5. Adoption of Plan Alternatives is not mutually exclusive

- 1. No Action
- 2. Northeast Ramapo Form-Based Code (FBC) Overlay
- 3. Open Space Preservation
- 4. Road Corridors
- 5. Transition Areas
- 6. Greater Density & Building Height in Centers
- 7. Expanded Walkable Neighborhoods
- 8. Educational Campus/Institution Standards
- 9. Affordable Business Space Incentive


