RECOVER from the COVID-19 pandemic by rebuilding upon a decade of data-driven, job-creating strategies and collaborative accomplishments in ways that reimagine our suburbs as a wealth-generating engine of growth, embracing diversity, inspiring innovation and unleashing the potential of all its people and places.

ENSURE all families access to safe, affordable childcare, delivered by well-trained and equitably compensated professionals, to nurture our children, empower parents to realize their earnings potential and provide businesses in all sectors the employees they need to accelerate the economy.

RE-INVIGORATE our retail base and re-establish Long Island as an innovative magnet for suburban living by transforming underutilized shopping centers, industrial parks and other "single-use" properties into new mixed-use neighborhoods; and by boosting small Main Street businesses with appealing housing, streetscapes, and culture, arts and entertainment venues.

Our Vision and Vow – An Introduction

Powering Past the Pandemic: The Imperative to Train The Workforce of Tomorrow to Fill Jobs *Today*

Jobs: They're always central to our vision for a vibrant region.

In the decade since the state pioneered an economic development paradigm that prioritized local input, the LIREDC has placed a high premium on employment, even during the pandemic's most devastating days.

We have always honored our vow to develop jobs through collaboration, consensus, and community inclusion – jobs, as part of an "equity economy," for people of all races, backgrounds, abilities, and socio-economic status.

Now, in a significant shift, we are sharpening our workforce focus. The LIREDC has undertaken a far-reaching reappraisal of employer and employee needs and is developing innovative approaches to meet them. Thousands of jobs remain unfilled, contributing to an economic state of the region that is uncertain. Long Island has not fully recovered from the pandemic, and we are coping with inflation and the prospect of a recession.

Therefore, more than ever, it is essential that the LIREDC and our stakeholders enthusiastically embrace this ongoing workforce development analysis, and act upon its conclusions. What is already clear, particularly from invaluable new state data, is that Long Island lacks enough well-trained workers necessary for growth of our region's economy.

Moreover, as detailed in Part II of this report, our own deeper analysis of Department of Labor survey data reveals troubling social, economic and geographic disparities in access to everything from job training and hiring opportunities to basic information about pipelines to employment. If the region and all its residents are to reach their full potential, we can't afford to leave anyone behind.

Our employment deficiencies are a problem for today and tomorrow; that's why we recommend that this level of review continue with both rigor and transparency beyond the pandemic.

What's also clear is that confronting the labor shortage must be an "all-hands-on-deck" endeavor. The lack of

highly skilled staff in the higher-paid tech sectors is especially troubling. As we seek to build a technology corridor, the surfeit of unfilled jobs is slowing the growth of our technology businesses and the customers they serve.

We must also gain a better understanding of how "remote workers" are filling the employment gaps in companies today. As businesses remain "hybrid" and positions continue to be hard to fill with locals, some companies are hiring talented people who reside outside of our region. There is also a rise in people relocating to states with lower costs of living but maintaining their current employment. While it is too early to fully understand both the positive and negative implications of remote work for our region, we must be mindful of it.

Thus, we have intentionally engaged local governments, businesses, unions, universities, community groups and human service providers to better understand the challenges they face and to determine how the state and the LIREDC can assist. How, for instance, can current and projected needs align with available training and wrap-around services — aid for everything from transportation and language skills to childcare and clothing. In a search for answers, we've also tasked all our expert and experienced work groups to think and act more holistically.

That is why we are trying to integrate new workforce development strategies with our long-standing efforts to advance placemaking, innovation, tradable sectors, tourism, and other work group areas. Housing provides just one glaring example of the need for sector connectivity: when it is difficult to find affordable homes in appealing places or to secure quality childcare at an affordable price, it becomes too easy for young workers to say "no" to our region. It is already happening — and could be devastating in the national competition for talent and investment.

It does not have to be that way. We have the potential to reverse any exodus and reclaim our status as a job-generating engine of growth. We detail our findings in Part II of the report, which is the heart of the 2022 annual update. The new data confirms what we have heard even before the pandemic: our challenge is no longer just creating jobs but filling them.

That is, of course, easier said than done, but it is a challenge the region is well-positioned to tackle. The elements of success are largely in place. We have a strong consensus among our leaders in business, labor, and government that the time to act in a coordinated fashion is now. We have an abundance of public and private "trade schools," including programs offered by our three BOCES; community colleges; four-year universities, and other institutions that provide largely unrivaled education, workforce training and job placement resources. The Regional Council can encourage collaboration among them in building networks for internships and apprenticeships and make sure that the programmatic dollars are well spent in classroom and workspace.

The time is now, and we must work together without delay. Even in the midst of a possible recession and growing uncertainty, a time that businesses often pare their payrolls, Long Island's employers are seeking to fill openings. However, whether in our "legacy" industries of aerospace manufacturing and agriculture, or at "new economy" enterprises of biotech, IT, and advanced manufacturing, theirs is no mere search for anyone with a pulse. They can not, and will not, hire just anyone. Given the rapid advance of technology, many of these jobs require skills or knowledge that can only be acquired through sophisticated training. These skills often need to be refreshed, in partnership with educational institutions and business support groups.



Farmingdale State College and Stony Brook University will partner with the State of NY (SUNY) and NYSERDA to support educational and training organizations including pre-apprenticeship training, for disadvantaged communities and workforce training initiatives.

At the same time, employees say they do not want just any job. Whether the Great Resignation is a temporary respite for burned out workers or a cultural shift with long-term implications remains to be determined. The data is ambiguous. But many employees say they desire a job with more "meaning" and wish to have more say in how a business operates and the values it embraces. Many companies are responding positively in revamping their HR policies. Employees are also realizing that they will not be able to reshape any corporation's culture if they do not have the qualifications to be hired by one.

The LIREDC now better understands the shifting dynamic between employers and employees and is positioning itself, with credibility and state support, as a workforce development resource for everyone on Long Island, from the C-suite to the assembly line.

We know we are fighting local, national, and even international headwinds. Surveys have found pessimism rampant on Long Island among executives and consumers. We can hear it at every supermarket or service station where people complain about prices. We can see it in employment and other business data: despite the gains by many companies and workers, the region is still faced with challenges.

But we face them with faith in ourselves and our partners. The LIREDC has confidence in the State's approach and commitment to economic development and in our strategic vision, stakeholder relationships and targeted plans for more "pathways to prosperity." Last year's additions and updates of our key strategies – on job creation, child care, and "green" wind energy – remain relevant to our Round 12 challenges. We have not, for instance, abandoned our dedication to balancing the environment and the economy in our Tourism and Natural Assets efforts, nor our Innovation agenda to turn Long Island into a technology hub connecting world-class universities and research centers.

Despite concerns and uncertainty, we see signs of revival everywhere. In many sectors, as well as communities, the "green shoots" that we noted in last year's report have blossomed into recovery. From new funding for innovative manufacturing and cutting-edge research, to crowded beaches, marinas, and Main Street restaurants – from higher reported revenues and lower unemployment – there is reason for optimism.

We certainly haven't forgotten that since March 2020 more than 12,000 of our neighbors have perished from Covid complications. Many businesses closed, and many others are still struggling. We also have not forgotten that the devastation was not evenly distributed: Black and Latino Long Islanders endured a disproportionate share of the lives and livelihoods lost. We intend to keep our promise to tackle these and other disparities.

Thus, the Council plans to continue a two-pronged approach to economic development and, more particularly, job training: We will support transformative projects that require thousands of workers at varying skill levels and that, regardless of their location, benefit the entire region. We also will seek out smaller, more localized projects that nonetheless have an outsized impact in underserved communities. Places like Wyandanch, among Suffolk's lowest-income hamlets, where the LIREDC-backed "rising" of new homes and businesses was supported by the community and union apprenticeship programs.

As a council and a region, we cannot let pessimism become its own pandemic.

If we want to continue as a "voice of the region," we must be both optimistic and realistic. If we want to maintain our credibility as a fair broker for change, the LIREDC will have to work harder and smarter to confront our challenges, old and new.

For instance, it is hardly "tilting at windmills" to prepare to make the most of the billions of dollars being invested in wind-energy projects off our shores. It is not just "happy talk" – it is happening here and now. An extraordinary alliance of government, business, labor, and higher education is collaborating on the National Offshore Wind Training Center. Initially focused on preparing workers to safely engage in various aspects of the emerging industry, the center and related programs will also connect local businesses to international wind energy giants and their coveted foreign direct investment.

It's certainly not pie-eyed optimism to see opportunity in confronting the childcare industry's problems, with the potential to benefit providers, caregivers, employers, parents and, of course, kids. This year, we will focus on reducing the labor shortage in the sector by supporting training for caregivers through workforce development programs to be identified later this fall. Governor Hochul had always made safe, affordable child care a personal priority while she oversaw all regional councils as lieutenant governor. She followed through recently by substantially increasing state subsidies for families and grants to providers. Advocates are grateful for the additional support and believe they have a strong partner for their cause. At the same time, they also worry that a recession or inflation could reverse the benefits of the new funding.

As noted earlier, the lack of affordable housing also adds to the dearth of employees. The LIREDC has preferred workforce housing projects that adhere to smart growth principles and enhance placemaking and downtown revitalization around commuter rail stations. We also believe that the first thing a developer should build is a collaborative relationship with our local governments and community partners. This approach has helped coax approvals and trust from sometimes reluctant villages and towns for several thousand downtown rental apartments.

Even with more housing in development, however, the new units don't come close to meeting a need estimated to be as high as 50,000 units. Thus, the long-term affordability problem has become a crisis. First, increased demand for spacious suburban homes – driven mostly by city residents escaping Covid – has sent selling prices and rents soaring. The recent wave of inflation has further complicated the housing market. The cost of land, financing, construction materials and labor – if skilled trades people can be found at all – have made affordable developments themselves less affordable to build.

So where will our relatively lower-paid workers live? North Carolina is a long commute to Long Island.

Our marching orders are clear: If we want the economy to grow, we must expand the scope and sophistication of our workforce development efforts. Now, in partnership with the state and local stakeholders, we are taking bold new steps toward a more prosperous region.

TAKING STOCK

A Fresh Accounting of our Workforce Development Assets and New Approaches to Aid Employers and Employees

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Confronting the challenge of economic uncertainty in our region through a collaborative effort with government, businesses, labor, universities, research centers and the not-for-profit sector has consistently been the hallmark of the LIREDC. Regional resiliency has been a long-term strength of Long Island, but sustained success requires a consistent effort by all stakeholders to inventory issues and coordinated resolutions. Our focus today is to solve a chronic shortage of qualified workers that started before 2020 and has been exacerbated by COVID. Continued success relies upon fresh research, savvy stakeholders, and being collaborative, transparent and unsparing in our self-appraisals.

It is now painfully clear we must do more to protect our region's fragile prosperity. To fulfil the vision of Governor Hochul we are comprehensively reevaluating the strengths and weakness of our workforce development networks while exploring our potential to create more powerful synergies within and between priority sectors. This includes our own "deeper-dive" analysis of state data that shows significant disparities in the opportunities afforded to people living in lowerwealth neighborhoods and those in higher-wealth ones. Such inequities are ultimately an impediment to prospective job seekers and to employers. We propose to address these and other disparities by building on a strong strategic foundation and doubling down on the proposals identified in prior reports.

The LIREDC is mining the data provided from the state survey more deeply and acting with greater urgency than ever before.

In the most general terms, we are now more focused on filling jobs than creating them. In the search for solutions, the state's business and job seeker surveys suggest that various wraparound services and financial assistance may, in general, facilitate job searches, education, and training for workers and, in particular, for women in lower-income, majority-minority communities.

After nearly two and half years of pandemic, it is unclear what the economic future holds at the broadest national scale – recession or growth, inflation, or price stability – and whether changes in the workplace and labor market are permanent or transitory.

What's also clear is that Long Island's economy continues to rest on a combination of key tradable sectors that offer great promise. Its workforce development infrastructure includes a robust network of schools, colleges and universities, and training programs that both develop and deliver programs with job placement in mind. The joint relationships between these institutions and leading businesses, fostered in the sustained engagements of the LIREDC and its Workforce Development work group, have made Long Island more inclusive and resilient.

Last year, the State asked the regional councils to revisit and revise their plans in light of the pandemic. The LIREDC responded by committing to building an equitable recovery, expanding access to affordable childcare that enabled more Long Islanders to return to work, re-invigorating our retail and housing bases through mixed-use development, and investing in climate change mitigation and adaptation.

In this year's report, we review the status and ongoing progress of the region's priority tradable sectors, highlight in-demand skill sets, address the needs of target populations, and identify potential wraparound services. We draw extensively from the NYS Department of Labor's survey, which helped clarify the needs of both businesses and job seekers and will help shape our planning as we move forward.

PRIORITY REGIONAL TRADABLE SECTORS

The LIREDC and its work groups have responded to the call for continuity and change by making a long-term commitment to key sectors, while at the same time recognizing emergent sectors poised for growth. In 2011, we identified advanced manufacturing, information technology, health care, life sciences, and "green" technology as key industry clusters for the region. In the years since, we have deepened the partnerships that drive job creation and skills development in each of these fields, while adding tourism and agribusiness and focusing our green tech efforts on the promise of offshore wind energy.

The manufacturing, life sciences and IT sectors are vital to the survival and prosperity of both Long Island and the nation. The region supplies everything from product safety seals; to washers, nuts, and bolts that hold together every type of machinery; to pharmaceuticals destined for domestic and international markets; to aerospace production for the US government.

MANUFACTURING

Manufacturing remains one of Long Island's most diverse and important sectors, making products that range from ground spices to components used by all defense military. Advanced manufacturing employs 34,000 workers across the region, the majority in chemical and computer / electronic manufacturing (NYS Department of Labor), but with a sizable aerospace and defense cluster of 200 small- to mid-size firms. Long Island has seen a profitable surge in pharma/ nutraceutical manufacturing as part of the tristate region that is listed as top five in the nation for this sector. Long Island's information technology and IT security supports the region's advanced manufacturing, in addition to being a tradable sector in its own right.

While most of our manufacturers were deemed essential during the COVID-19 pandemic and remained open, they had to adapt to new safety protocols, supply chain shortages, and other logistics problems. One of the most significant challenges, however, is finding skilled workers to fill open positions. In the short term, employers are working to remediate training gaps for potential and existing employees. In the long term, their goals are to recruit employees into the manufacturing employment pipeline and fulfill the growing demand for manufacturing positions.

In fact, despite the challenging environment, many manufacturers have undertaken exciting new projects, and last year eight firms received funds for expansion. These awardees included Chocolate Works, a candy and chocolate manufacturer that will purchase machinery and hire forty new full-time employees to create new product lines and expand distribution. Exergy, a manufacturer of heating conductors, will bring their brazing process in house, allowing them to hire six new employees. In the aerospace sector GSE Dynamics recently completed a project to purchase new CNC machines and hired five new employees to better meet the needs of their clients.

Collaboration and communication are key. To build the manufacturing employment pipeline, companies and their workforce development partners, including BOCES and community colleges, are working together to develop new apprenticeship and pre-apprenticeship programs. Presenting manufacturing careers and the ladder to success at an early level and the ability to teach and train children still in high school is crucial to filling the employment gaps that are consistently widening.

OFFSHORE WIND

The offshore wind industry is projected to add over 10,000 jobs on Long Island over the next 15 years. The majority of these positions will be management/ professional and installation/repair jobs. But the growth of the sector will also present opportunities for new positions in manufacturing (metal and composite component parts) and services (e.g., marine transportation, inspection, and supply delivery). The growth of the green energy sector offers opportunities to draw a younger generation into highly skilled manufacturing positions, and to spur innovation in areas such as wind blade optimization, mass battery storage, hydrogen power, and grid management technologies. The skills they learn now to enter the offshore wind employment pipeline will prepare them for work in many other sectors.

Recent research by the BW Research Partnership ("2022 New York Offshore Wind Workforce Gap Analysis") has identified occupations with the most significant training gaps. Four have "severe" gaps: Plant and System Operators, Hoist and Winch Operators, Continuous Mining Machine Operators, and Wind Turbine Service Technicians. While the new offshore wind workforce will draw talent with varying educational levels, the BW study finds that, "the top 10 occupations with projected severe or moderate workforce gaps require either an apprenticeship/ postsecondary training or a high school diploma." The BW gap analysis finds that ample opportunities exist for vocational training that provide "baseline knowledge" for occupations such as electricians, machinists, technicians, and equipment operators that are essential in offshore wind construction and operation. But additional industry-training is needed. As the site for much of the state's future wind energy capacity, Long Island is leading the way in creating a talent pipeline for wind energy. Stony Brook University and Farmingdale State College launched the Offshore Wind Training Institute in 2020-2021, with a goal of training 2,500 workers for jobs in the field. Stony Brook's offerings are geared towards professional services, while Farmingdale's focus on wind turbine technology.

New investments at Suffolk County Community College, planned as part of the Sunrise Wind Project, include a new \$10 million National Offshore Wind Training Center (NOWTC) that will prepare the workforce for the emerging offshore wind industry. The center's initial focus will be training for Global Wind Organization certifications, reflecting industry standards for safe practices while working at sea. In more general terms, the NOWTC will coordinate with union apprenticeship programs and area colleges to augment the workforce training of offshore wind developers and companies in the supply chain. It will also seek grants to train individuals, with an emphasis on those from underserved communities. It's not only the right thing to do, but the smart thing for the entire economy.

TOURISM, HOSPITALITY, AND AGRIBUSINESS

Leisure and hospitality added the second greatest number jobs of any regional industry from 2013 to 2018. On the eve of the pandemic the state Department of Labor had projected that future employment would grow at nearly twice the rate of all industries. Tourism and hospitality suffered direct and immediate impacts from the pandemic's restrictions on travel and indoor dining, but they remain key tradable sectors for the region's economy. Tourism has rebounded thanks, in part, to restaurants reopening. We also have seen the agriculture, seafood, and commercial fishing industries begin to recover.

The pandemic highlighted the need for value-added production and processing facilities, which not only ensure the freshness (and thus value) of the fish and seafood products but jobs in the sector and others (such as restaurants) that rely on them. The Town of Southampton has completed job-generating renovations to the Shinnecock Commercial Fishing Dock which will improve pack out and processing for the commercial fishing vessels. On the North Fork, the Mattituck Commercial Fishing Dock is undergoing renovations that will allow six more commercial fishing vessels to use the facility.

The question is: Who will do these jobs and where will they learn how to do them? Training gaps persist, particularly for young workers and entrepreneurs seeking to build a career in agriculture and fishing. There are few programs that enable young workers to learn the management skills and develop the broad knowledge (of accounting, labor laws, etc.) required to operate a farm, fishery, or seafood business. Mentorships and apprenticeships also play an important role in recruiting workers and expanding existing programs that would help provide them with necessary skills.


For entry-level workers in hospitality, tourism, and agriculture, a combination of high housing costs, low wages, and limited public transportation have hampered recruitment and retention. Despite opportunities for advancement, the most common occupations require only short-term training and offer below-average annual wages. This aggravates the problem of housing affordability, and vice versa, a major impediment to finding workers for restaurants and farms. Across Long Island, but especially on the East End, many workers are unable to find affordable housing close to their jobs; as a result, they live further away and must make an increasingly costly and time consuming commute. Public transportation schedules are rarely synchronized with typical commuting times in the hospitality industry; therefore, many workers are unable to use public transportation to get to their jobs. This only adds to commuting costs and, in turn, contributes to congestion and pollution.

The particular challenges of these sectors illustrate how, especially in the current tight labor market, placemaking, improvements to transportation infrastructure, and comprehensive regional planning are closely related to workforce development.

HEALTHCARE

While not necessarily a tradable sector, according to the NYSDOL, healthcare remains poised to continue its strong growth through 2022 and beyond. Hospitals, medical offices, veterinary services, and testing laboratories make up a significant portion of Long Island employment and potential opportunities. Each of these sub-sectors are having difficulty attracting healthcare employees for open jobs. We don't believe it would be wise to ignore such a sizeable portion of employment and general economic activity. According to the state survey, direct Support Professionals and Personal Care Aide and other health-related jobs have ranked high on the list of needed positions. Same for Child Care Assistance and Certified Nursing Assistant. To the extent Long Island institutions and residents cannot find employees to fill these critical care-giving roles, many people in all sectors will be unable to return to work, either part- or full-time.

IN-DEMAND SKILL SETS

Employers across the spectrum have struggled to attract and retain pools of workers with the skills necessary to enable our businesses to grow and compete. In many respects, this is not new. The members of the Workforce Development work group have long recognized the dual challenge of increasing awareness of career pathways (especially in manufacturing), enhancing skills and job preparedness, and reducing barriers to labor force participation. In an encouraging sign of recovery, the regional economy has regained most of the jobs it lost in early 2020. But an inordinate number of positions remain unfilled, further constraining growth. A lack of childcare and flexible workplace accomodations have contributed to workforce imbalances. But the primary reason is the lack of workers with the proper skills.

Basic Technical Skills - In this changed environment, the surveys both statewide and in the region reveal that employers face new challenges beyond those of career awareness and technical proficiency. Workers and recent high school and college graduates still often lack basic technical skills (in the trades), payroll and bookkeeping skills (in administrative roles), and general digital literacy. Employers now also struggle to find workers with the soft skills required for job readiness, and to retain talent once they find it.

Soft Skills - Given changes in the workplace, soft skills have become increasingly important. Remote workers are often less directly supervised and in-person workers must frequently adapt and adjust to the changing circumstances of pandemic-era work. More than half of employers who responded to the state's survey in 2021 and 2022 reported that workers lacked soft skills such as self-motivation, timeliness, communication skills, attention to detail, and (in 2021) critical thinking. Long Island employers echoed these findings, reporting that new hires lacked self-motivation and follow through, commitment, professionalism (e.g., dress), and conflict resolution skills. All of these are critical, teachable and transferable skills that impact productivity and effectiveness.

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Long Island's community colleges, as well as the "continuing ed" programs at four-year schools, can play key roles in providing technical and soft skills though both credit and non-credit certificate programs; so can the region's Educational Opportunity Centers, which are expanding and enhancing their program offerings to prepare participants for higher-paying positions. Most of the Employment Opportunity Center's 1,500 participants have come from underrepresented minority populations.

Yet, these strategies require that employers are able to retain employees long enough to benefit from these initiatives. Employers face the headwinds of a tight labor market, in which workers are motivated to search for higher quality jobs. Many manufacturers are willing to provide extensive on-the-job training, yet even when they locate appropriate candidates, many do not show up for interviews.



Manufacturing - In the manufacturing sector, Long Island companies that responded to the state's employer survey consistently reported that applicants and new hires lacked non-technical skills and traits such as effective communication, problem-solving and critical thinking, self-motivation, and timeliness/ attendance. In addition, 25% of manufacturers reported that applicants lacked the basic math skills needed for their positions, as well as more advanced mechanical/ technical skills (24%) and chemical/technical skills (43%). Manufacturers who participated in our work groups confirmed this data, identifying a need for more skilled laborers with both specific technical skills - for example, machinists and sheet metal fabricators – and less specialized but still essential skills such as good verbal communication.

In the state survey, a majority of manufacturers (68%) named lack of experience as one of the five most common barriers preventing their company from hiring a candidate, or preventing the candidate from taking the job (compared to 54% of all companies). This underscores the need for a fully developed manufacturing employment pipeline that provides apprenticeship and pre-apprenticeship programs.

Offshore Wind - As explained in the prior section, the offshore wind industry requires general technical skills for positions that include electricians, machinists, technicians, and equipment operators. The BW Gap Analysis, as well as conversations with work group members and other stakeholders, indicates that additional industry-training is needed for occupations such as Plant and System Operators, Hoist and Winch Operators, Continuous Mining Machine Operators, and Wind Turbine Service Technicians. New programs described above, at Stony Brook University, Farmingdale State College, and Suffolk County Community College are expanding to meet these needs and fill existing training gaps.

Healthcare - A third of health care sector employers stressed the importance of customer service as a non-technical skill lacking among applicants and new hires. The in-demand technical skill sets included computer literacy (50%), Excel proficiency (41%), and familiarity with electronic health record software (16%). These needs align with those recognized in past progress reports. Beginning in Round 1, LIREDC provided support for new medical records training programs, and prompted by ACA's integration of patient satisfaction into Medicaid and Medicare reimbursement, the LIREDC recognized the importance of hospitality and customer service training and education in health care settings. Natural Assets, Tourism and Agribusiness - Council work group members noted that there is significant ownership turnover within the agribusiness sector, particularly in farming and fishing. Fewer farms are being passed down intergenerationally: owners' children find work in other sectors, even as farming enjoys renewed interest among young workers, including college graduates, who are interested in sustainable food production. And the high prices fetched for land, particularly on the East End, make selling farmland more appealing to "next gen" owners not committed to the difficult life of farming. As noted, the in-demand skills for these workers are essentially the entrepreneurial ones, such as at least cursory knowledge of accounting, labor laws and other information necessary to operate a farm, fishery, or seafood business.

The agriculture and tourism sectors offer a wide range of job opportunities, from farming and farm stands, to vineyard chemists and soil quality specialists. Some pay well and require advanced training. But many jobs are part-time and/or low-wage and are difficult around which to build a career. Training for many of the lower-skilled jobs occurs at the work place, where a senior waiter, for instance, would "show the ropes" to a new hire. There is often no formal pathway for advancement into management, much less ownership, for those who would find that appealing.

But those positions require not only on-the-job experience but skills requiring formal education and even industry certification. As in operating a farming and fishing business, these administrative and supervisory positions demand skills – ranging from deep knowledge to general conversance – in information technology, bookkeeping, personnel, communications, marketing and others.

Thus, more attention should be paid to providing employees with the ability to do not only entry level or low-skilled jobs but to step up to better-paying jobs that could lead to careers and increased economic input for our region. One example is the hospitality curriculum at St. Joseph's University.

Another advantage of training tourism and agriculture workers in advanced skills is that what they learn can be applied to jobs within the sector and in others. This helps create a more flexible workforce that can adapt their skills to changing employment trends. When broken down, the skills used and highly sought after are in demand in most other industries: critical thinking, problem solving, reading and comprehension, research, and math.

TARGET POPULATIONS FOR WORKFORCE TRAINING

From the beginning, the LIREDC recognized that inclusion had to be a top priority in a region where educational and labor force outcomes reflected longstanding discrimination and segregation. The council discovered that labor force training needs often vary widely across groups and communities.

Entry-level Workers - A key target population, these groups include those who have not attended college. Employers are willing to train these prospective workers on site; yet they face the barriers described above: employees lack soft and technical skills, seek flexible schedules and enhanced compensation that employers are not accustomed to providing at the entry level. These potential workers may not be aware of career opportunities. Teachers and counselors in K-12 schools don't always present the entire range of options for full time, well-paying jobs available to their graduates, and in some case are unaware themselves.

Low Income Population - This second target population intersects the first, but is defined by geography: residents of places where structural inequality has meant disinvestment in school systems, small businesses, and infrastructure. These are places where workers have been historically excluded from the benefits of regional growth. For many of these workers, the challenges of living in a particular place are compounded by barriers related to race/ethnicity, gender, country of origin, and ability. As a result, a disproportionate number are digitally disconnected, or are still learning English, or have job history gaps due to incarceration. For all of these reasons, and more, they have the greatest needs for training and assistance with job placement and retention.

From 2013 onward, the LIREDC incorporated this person- and place-based outlook into an Opportunity Agenda that focused on Wyandanch, one of the region's highest-need areas. We paired concentrated investments in infrastructure and job training with deep community engagement, and our approach became a model for the state.

WRAPAROUND SERVICES

The council and its work groups continue to seek opportunities to invest in disadvantaged communities and deliver training and wraparound services appropriate for each target population. These may include transportation, social-emotional supports, ESL classes, child care, health, housing, adaptive technologies.

The state's survey provides valuable data, as it asked job seekers to identify the major barriers to both employment and additional education or training. Given the importance of place, the Workforce Development work group conducted additional analysis to tease out geographic and group disparities. Dr. Christopher Niedt, Academic Director of the National Center for Suburban Studies at Hofstra University, used Census data to identify Long Island ZIP codes that were majority-minority and had household incomes below the regional median. Professor Niedt then divided survey respondents between those in majority-minority and lower-than-median income ZIPs and all others.

The results appear in the tables at the end of this section, with differences of greater than 10% appearing in bold. Most notably, women in lower-income, majority-minority ZIP codes consistently perceive more barriers to employment and education:

- A majority (54%) reported that they either lack the right degree or credential (45%) and/or have insufficient education or training (43%) to pursue the jobs they want. Only 40% of male job seekers in comparably advantaged ZIP codes faced any of these barriers.
- A majority (62%) also expressed concern about their lack of professional networks (44%), lack of past experience (40%), and inability to practice for potential job interview questions (26%). For men in other ZIP codes, only 48% expressed one or more of these concerns.
- Twenty-three percent of the women did not have reliable transportation, and 20% did not have a driver's license.

Similar disparities appear in our analysis of barriers to pursuing further education:

• Over 60% of women and men in disadvantaged ZIP codes cited cost as a barrier, compared to 51% of job-seeking women in other ZIP codes and 40% of men.

- Forty-two percent of women in disadvantaged ZIP codes identified current loan debt as a problem, compared to only 25% of men in other ZIP codes.
- A majority of these women (51%) either didn't know where to start in seeking additional training / education (38%), believed that programs didn't exist (32%), and/or worried that the programs would be too difficult (29%). The corresponding figures for men with any of these concerns in disadvantaged and advantaged ZIP codes were 34% and 37%, respectively.

The key question now is what is to be done about eliminating barriers to training and employment that are impeding not only our emergence from the pandemic but our potential for sustaining prosperity that is accessible to all our residents.

Coordination and collaboration are key. Particularly when it comes to wraparound services, a partnership between the public, private, and non-profit sectors could have a positive impact by supporting initiatives that:

- Guide companies in creating internship or apprenticeship programs and support interns / apprentices through the process;
- Recruit job seekers and shepherd them through training programs, providing one-on-one support;
- Provide remedial education classes and/or tutoring for struggling students;
- Enhance soft skills and/or job readiness training covering topics like resume writing, job interviews, and time management;
- Organize opportunities for job seekers to familiarize themselves with career pathways and opportunities for reskilling, and to begin building personal networks and mentorship relationships within fields of interest;
- Provide financial assistance for training programs, and support initiatives for student loan relief; and
- Establish programs that facilitate and subsidize transportation to/from training and job sites.

Finally, it is essential to follow individuals after program completion both to provide ongoing support, and to measure outcomes, building longitudinal/impact data that can inform refinements to regional services. **Flexible Work Accommodations** - The state job seeker survey provides clues about the types of jobs that today's workers find desirable. When asked to identify the incentives that they would like employers to offer, over 30 percent of respondents chose paid time off, higher pay, and ability to work remotely (part- or full-time) as the most appealing. Many responders ranked them ahead of other options like promotional opportunities, retention bonuses, and performancebased pay. These results suggest that employers will need to provide additional compensation and work-life flexibility to recruit and retain workers in a broader range of fields, and for a broader range of positions.

PART THREE

Participation



The LIREDC relies heavily on relationships. Much of the credit for our accomplishments belongs to our partnerships with stakeholder organizations and the individuals who lead them. But it's the expert and experienced volunteers on our various work groups who truly elevate our efforts with up-to-date information and penetrating insights. At the same time, our work group members act as a two-way street of communication, letting their constituencies know more about the LIREDC's aspirations and activities.

Over the years, we have refocused and reconstituted our work groups in recognition of shifting obstacles and new opportunities. Last year, all of the work groups were tasked to focus almost exclusively on the impact of the pandemic. This year, in response to Governor Hochul's vision, we asked all of them to pivot again to explore and execute new approaches to workforce development.

Work Groups

CHILD CARE

The Child Care work group is a dedicated team of professionals representing both Suffolk and Nassau County Child Care Councils, workforce development leaders, training providers, corporate representatives and labor, all focusing on sustainable solutions to the shortage of child care due to the high costs of operations for providers, affordability for parents, and pay equity for the staff. Without safe, affordable child care, Long Island's economy – and many individuals, especially women and minorities – cannot achieve their full potential. Child Care concerns remain a key factor for both men and women, when determining whether it makes sense to have one parent leave the workforce to be home with their child.

EQUITY

The Equity work group is made up of professionals in the fields of community development, education, social services, minority and women owned business enterprises (MWBEs) and economic development and planning. The work group analyzes the disparities affecting our minority communities. In the wake of Covid-19's disparate impact on Blacks and Latinos, the work group identifies underlying inequities in education (including the digital divide), healthcare access, housing, financial supports for MWBE small businesses, food and childcare deserts.

INNOVATION AND INDUSTRY CLUSTER

The Innovation work group is comprised of leadership from the region's premier universities and research institutions as well as technology acceleration entities and venture capital providers. In 2016 this group identified biotechnology as the region's industry cluster and developed specific strategies to foster it. While focusing on biotechnology, the work group continues to identify and shape new industry clusters including artificial intelligence and machine learning, cyber-security and renewable energy. It also is developing and supporting projects that align with regional strategies for technology business formation and commercialization.

MANUFACTURING AND INDUSTRY

The Manufacturing and Industry work group is comprised of members from the manufacturing sector, the public and private sectors, as well as academic institutions, with the goal of developing strategies that identify the needs of Long Island's tradeable sectors and opportunities for the long-term sustainability of these industries. With the understanding that the strength of the region's economy is dependent on the success of our manufacturers, the work group seeks to understand the barriers to growth that can make it challenging for Long Island manufacturers and exporters to access new domestic and international markets and identify programs and resources that can support our producers.

NATURAL ASSETS AND TOURISM

The Natural Assets and Tourism work group features a broad mix of individuals that represent Long Island's agriculture, commercial fishing, shell fishing, tourism, and preservation industries. Since 2011, the group has devised strategies to enhance the economic potential of our Natural Assets and Tourism industries. The group looks to better understand the challenges that our heritage industries face and develop solutions that can help promote the growth of our agriculture, seafood, and beverage industries, encourage the preservation of our historic assets, and continue to attract tourism to our entire region. The work group recognizes the inter-woven importance of these industries and encourages a better understanding of the unique challenges they face, so that projects and programs can be developed to eliminate barriers and support growth.

OFFSHORE WIND

The Offshore Wind work group is comprised of professionals from labor, academia and industry who will continue to seek to identify regional opportunities for developing the nation's first offshore wind supply chain in support of the construction, installation and operation of offshore wind projects.

PLACEMAKING

The Placemaking work group is a team of professionals from various backgrounds including municipal partners, labor and development industry leaders. The members work to tailor strategies to encourage downtown and single land-use locations to develop sustainable "places" towards meeting modern expectations and needs in the 21st century. While continuing with their support of downtown revitalization projects, the work group seeks to replicate successfully utilized strategies while also focusing on single land-use developments to support diversification efforts within the region.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

The Workforce Development work group is one of our larger and most active groups consisting of representatives from government, labor, business, industry, and conventional and non-conventional educational environments. This group meets multiple times to develop strategies to assist harder to employ populations, such as the disabled, veterans, and the previously incarcerated. They also focus on methods to better prepare all workers for the jobs of tomorrow, through industry/academic partnerships and apprenticeships.

WRITERS

The Writers work group consists of dedicated individuals embedded in our work groups and whose knowledge of Long Island and ties to the community – as well as their writing ability – allows them to weave the narrative and analytic tale of our regional progress and our promise. Our story could not be told with such aspirational eloquence and expertise without these individuals who give so much of their time and talent.

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Public Outreach and Engagement

Communication is critical. Over the last decade, the LIREDC has relied on a transparent and collaborative exchange of ideas, information and insights from our diverse stakeholders. The more that organizations know about how we might help with the challenges they face – and the more we know about their employment and other needs – the better we all can do our jobs to grow the region. That's why the LIREDC and the Empire State Development staff puts such a high premium on engaging with our partners in government, business, labor, not-for-profits, community groups, educational providers and research institutions.

During the past two years, as the pandemic took its terrible toll, we conducted much of our business remotely. We shared informational notices via email, Zoom webinars and on our social media platforms to a total audience of over 10,000 people. Lives and livelihoods literally depended on workplace health and safety guidance and knowledge of funding opportunities. This year, we were able to meet the public... *in* public. And as safely as possible, we took advantage of the opportunity. To ensure transparency, the Council held a number of public meetings attended by nearly 3,000 people. These included events from the jam-packed annual Hauppauge Industrial Association Trade Show to more intimate, mutually informative exchanges with village chambers of commerce. Council members and ESD staff also met with our partners in local government, often about the Downtown Revitalization Initiative, which helps explain the robust response to the annual RFP.

Recognizing that much commerce is still conducted online, the LIREDC and ESD continued to make use of interactive technologies. The Council's public meetings were available on line in real time. And for the convenience of people seeking funding, we held our version of Shark Tank – a parade of potentially productive proposals – virtually. This meeting, like other LIREDC events, received significant media coverage.

PART FOUR Previously Funded CFA Projects

Despite an unprecedented pandemic that disrupted businesses and government agencies, last year the LIREDC conscientiously continued our efforts to support job-generating projects. And we succeeded. The 58 projects approved by ESD saw Long Island's 10-year totals reach \$770 million in NYS funding for 1,042 projects leveraging project investments of \$4.6 billion.

IN BALL

Introduction

The 1,042 projects did more than leverage billions of dollars into LI's economy, creating or retaining nearly 30,000 jobs – paths to prosperity for employees and employers alike. One by one, through a careful, collaborative process that created and activated regional strategies, the LIREDC has helped transform these suburbs. Once, businesses, research centers, human service organizations and local governments not only went their own way but too often worked at crossed purposes. Now, along with universities such as Stony Brook and Hofstra, they forge consensus and work together productively. And the result is a greater appreciation of one another's needs and measurable progress toward meeting them. Here are several projects – not the biggest headline makers or most expensive but representative of the arc of our achievements and synergies between sectors.

Below are a few examples:

The Boys and Girls Club of Locust Valley was awarded an ESD Capital Grant of \$54,000 in 2019 to expand child care, job training and other services in a new Technology, Media, and Digital Arts lab. Completed in 2021, the programs – focused on the workforce of today and tomorrow – are fully operating.

New York Institute of Technology College of Osteopathic Medicine, located in Old Westbury, was awarded an ESD Grant of \$1,050,00 in 2021. The funds supported a private investment \$14,500,000 to create a Microscopy Innovation Center to advance research and breakthrough treatments for neurodegenerative diseases, clinical depression, and more while training workers in diagnostic microscopy, visualization, and imaging technologies. The project is estimated for completion in January 2024.

GSE Dynamics was awarded a \$300,000 ESD Grant in 2019 to support a private investment of \$1.5 million for new machinery and equipment at the aerospace and defense manufacturer's Hauppauge facility and renovations to increase their production capacity. This investment allowed them to add five additional jobs to a workforce of 68. The Round 9 project was completed last December. **Exergy,** a Garden City-based maker of heat exchangers, was awarded a \$250,000 ESD grant and up to \$60,000 in Excelsior Jobs Tax Credits in 2021 to bring their brazing process in-house. This will not only make Exergy more competitive, but will add six new employees by repatriating a key component of their production that is currently outsourced. Completion of this Round 11 project is anticipated early next year.

Riverview Lofts, an affordable housing project in the underserved Town of Riverhead by developer Georgica Green, was awarded an ESD Capital Grant of \$300,000 in 2017 toward infrastructure, including encasing a sewer line, relocating electrical services, extending a water main, and installing fire hydrants. The project was completed in 2020 and will aid the revival of Riverhead – one of Long Island's oldest towns, the Gateway to the Hamptons – with 116 rental units at various levels of affordability and 12,000 sq. ft. of retail space.

The Mattituck Commercial Fishing Dock was awarded a \$500,000 ESD grant in 2021 to support a private investment of \$110,000 to improve one of the only commercial docks on the North Fork. Improvements will include five additional slips for commercial fishing vessels, dockside water and electric services, and replacing a bulkhead. The Round 11 project is expected to be completed in Fall 2022.

CAST (Community Action Southold Town) was awarded \$300,000 in 2019. As a result of the agency's reliable performance, CAST (now the Center for Advocacy Support and Transformation to reflect an expanded mission) was awarded \$65,000 in 2021. Now, in addition to food, language skills, workforce training, childcare and other assistance, CAST will meet other needs of lower-wage, often immigrant workers sought by the surging agriculture and tourism industries. As a comprehensive community resource center – the first of its kind on the North Fork – CAST will offer a range of arts, culture, and recreation program.




